Candidate for State Senate 36th District

In 1970 K.C. Dickson earned a Bachelor of Arts in Economics from the University of Kansas and a commission in the USAF. In 1973 he earned his law degree from Duke University School of Law. K.C.'s Professional Military Education includes graduation from the Air War College, National Security Management Course and Air Command and Staff College.



He is a retired military attorney (Judge Advocate, Lt Col. USAF) currently teaching law courses as an adjunct professor for Mt. San Jacinto College. K.C. has also been a Trustee for the Murrieta Valley Unified School District for about twelve years and served with several community organizations on their boards or as officers on boards including The Salvation Army, The Gideons International, the Lincoln Club of Southwest Riverside County and the Golden Valley Music Society. In 2001, Greg followed in his father's and grandfather's footsteps and became a pastor. He and his family relocated to Southern California to lead Father's House Church in La Mesa.
